SY 22-23 REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

Note: Please use this checklist for all required documents upon registering at the school. *Incomplete* registration packets *will not* be accepted.

Completed packets may be dropped off at the main office or emailed to machananaoelementaryschool@gdoe.net PLEASE BRING THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS:

If transferring from another public or private school, you must provide an <i>OFFICIAL</i> WITHDRAWAL and a copy of previous school year report card showing grade promoted to.
Physical Examination Form or appointment card (if scheduled after the first day of the school
year- not more than 30 days after the first day of the school year).
Health audit from Headstart or other GDOE Public School.
Updated Immunization Shot Record - Shots must be updated as of the date of registration. PPD skin test results must have been read no more than one year prior to registration.
Birth Certificate (ORIGINAL) or Passport
Social Security Card (not required).
Proof of Residency : Mayor's Verification or a Utility Bill (showing name and physical address), or lease/rental agreement or a notarized statement of living arrangement.
LEGAL DOCUMENTS (if applicable): Any legal documents pertaining to the child regarding: -Divorced or Separated Parents who have legal custody of child (Court Documents) or -Legal Guardianship (Court Documents)

NOTE: NEW Kindergarten Registration:

Child must be 5 years old on or before July 31st. Uniforms are mandatory and are being sold at Royal Bics
